Metropolitan Police Service (MPS) Christmas Tree Appeal 2023

May we send our warmest regards in the lead up to the festive period, and we hope you are all keeping safe and well.

We are planning this year's Christmas Tree Appeal, working in partnership again with The Childhood Trust (TCT), with the aim of delivering Christmas presents to young people across London, who may not otherwise receive a gift. This year's appeal will be ever more important as families navigate the continuing cost of living crisis.

TCT targets the 700,000 children living in poverty in London. They help vulnerable children to overcome the disadvantages caused by poverty such as hunger, homelessness, stress, loneliness and anxiety. Their work supports children from across London and is aimed at engaging the most disadvantaged children from the poorest communities.

The charity's network of over 150 projects provides practical, emotional and inspirational support, delivered by trusted caring adults. These projects help children to achieve their full potential, despite facing many challenges. To date their work has supported over 180,000 disadvantaged children in London. Any raised funds which are not used to purchase a gift this for a vulnerable child this Christmas, will be used by TCT to continue their essential work for the following year.

The Metropolitan Police are therefore very proud to be working in partnership with this charity again this year, and the Commissioner has already selected the winning poster entry to be the front image for this year's appeal. We have run this appeal since 2011, and in 2022 we managed to secure a gift for nearly 17,000 vulnerable children aged 0 - 16.
